Re: Availability of the Growth Reporting System (GRS) for Viewing 2012–13 Educator State-Provided Growth Results

We are writing to provide you with information about the availability of the secure online Growth Reporting System (GRS) for educators in districts to view their State-provided growth results. Today the GRS will be available via EngageNY at <http://www.engageny.org/resource/secure-online-growth-reporting-system>¹. The GRS enables authorized teachers, principals, and district personnel to securely access State-provided 2012-13 educator growth results and growth data as well as 2011–12 data, if applicable. Specific details about user access and login information are outlined below². For more information on State-provided growth results, please see our August 2013 memorandum, entitled Delivery of 2012-13 Educator State-Provided Growth Results at <http://www.engageny.org/sites/default/files/resource/attachments/growthscorefieldmemo.pdf>.

We are relying on you to inform teachers in grades 4-8 English Language Arts (ELA) and math to whom this applies, their principals, and principals with grades 9-12 (all grades) of the availability of this website for viewing their individual growth data. Please share the information in this memo, including the attached Teacher and Principal Information Sheets, with these educators³. The teachers and principals that were in the data files you received through the IRS Portal are those included in the GRS. Please use and refer to the materials distributed to you in August to support your conversations and address questions that you may receive (see <http://www.engageny.org/resource/resources-about-state-growth-measures>).

In addition to providing the growth rating and score used in each educator's APPR, the GRS details results by grade, subject and student group which may assist in supporting instructional improvement and helping principals in identifying schoolwide needs. Student rosters are also available with student-level information that districts provided for use in constructing measures.

As promised in our memo of August 22, there will also be six (6) additional files available today on the IRS Portal for district use that include information that will be visible to users of the GRS but was not sent with the files you needed to complete your APPRs. This information includes the student-level data used in the calculation of the growth scores and provides further detail on teacher and principal growth results⁴.

² Authorized users of the GRS include superintendents, principals, and teachers. In order to be an authorized user of the GRS, teachers must have an active Teacher Student Roster Verification (TSRV) account with NYSED, available at <http://www.p12.nysed.gov/irs/teacher/>; principals and superintendents must have an account for the NYSED Application Business Portal available at <http://portal.nysed.gov>.

The roster information provides educators with the inputs used in the statewide statistical model, but is not sufficient to replicate the adjusted MGPs used for APPR purposes.

We want to express our appreciation to all those who worked so diligently to report, collect, and verify these data. Our APPR system relies on multiple measures and for those educators who have State-provided growth scores for the State Growth or Other Comparable Measures subcomponent, these results combined with results from the Locally-selected Measures subcomponent and Other Measures of Effectiveness subcomponent offer valuable insights to help strengthen instructional practices of every teacher and principal. It is important to also recognize that 2012-13 is the first year students have been assessed against the more rigorous standards and employment decisions informed by any measure of effectiveness should be made judiciously⁵.

Thank you for your leadership and continued commitment to ensuring that every student in New York has the opportunity to graduate from high school ready for college and career.

LOGIN INFORMATION: Growth Reporting System Authorized Users

Superintendents will access the system using their username and password for the NYSED Application Business Portal System. Superintendents will be able to view data for all schools and teachers within their district. Teachers will be able to view data for their assigned courses and students. *As the data in GRS are confidential, it is critical that you maintain security by not sharing usernames and/or passwords.*

- Teachers who have not created a TSRV account should visit <http://www.p12.nysed.gov/irs/teacher/> and contact their principal and/or district data coordinator in order to get a personal identification number (PIN) that will allow them to complete the account creation process. Note that PINs are generated only after a district submits teacher-student data linkage (TSDL) information for a teacher to the Student Information Repository System (SIRS). TSRV and GRS are separate systems: TSRV will allow teachers to view any roster data submitted to the SIRS by their district; GRS will allow teachers to see the results for the 2012-13 school year which were used as part of the Annual Professional Performance Reviews (APPRs). The GRS also contains additional detail for each educator that may be helpful for instructional improvement and it allows educators to see student rosters with the student- level data provided by their District and used by AIR to construct these measures.
